Even that tall boy named Mike.


The trees grow their leaves back

Corona Crisis

Covid-19 was initially seen in China toward the end of 2019. Many people refer to it as covid-19, coronavirus, or SARS-CoV-2 (Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome). When the virus invades a person, it usually gets in through their nose or mouth, and they will contract the disease.
